There are a number of different levels of apprenticeships as follows:

NAME	LEVEL	EQUIVALENT
Intermediate	2	5 GCSE passes at grade A*-C or 9-4
Advanced	3	2 A level passes / Level 3 Diploma / International Baccalaureate
Higher	4, 5, 6 and 7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 and 7	Bachelor's or master's degree

Apprenticeships offer a training wage enabling students to enter the world of work far earlier, offering employment with training.
